



# Telemedicine tips for providers - 2023

Aetna Better Health® of Illinois provides this tip sheet to address some of the most common questions about telemedicine. If you need more info about telemedicine services, please contact your Quality Provider Liaison.

Note: We recognize there can be conflicting definitions of terms, especially asynchronous and synchronous visit types.

| Common terms                         | Definition   | Coding  |

| <b>Telemedicine</b>                  | The practice of medicine using technology to deliver care at a distance. Practitioners in one location (distant site) use telecommunications to deliver care to patients at another location.  |   |
| <b>Telehealth</b>                    | <p>A two-way interaction between providers and patients through telecommunication devices. It is the direct delivery of health care services to a patient, related to diagnosis, treatment and management of a condition.</p> <p>Telehealth can be delivered via synchronous interactive real-time electronic communication comprising both audio and video elements, or asynchronous (audio or video elements) telephone calls, remote patient monitoring and communication via secure electronic mail or a secure patient portal.</p> <p>This is an alternative approach to in-person visits for qualified providers to deliver care and services to patients.</p> | <p><b>Modifiers:</b> 95, GT<br/><b>Telehealth POS:</b> 02</p> <p><b>* Some codes might not be covered by HFS' Practitioner Fee Schedule but are required to close HEDIS gaps in care.</b></p>   |
| <b>Synchronous telehealth visits</b> | <p><b>Require real-time face-to-face interactive audio and visual (video) telecommunications with patients.</b> A measure specification that is silent about telehealth includes synchronous telehealth. This is because telehealth is billed using standard CPT and HCPCS codes for professional services in conjunction with a telehealth modifier and/or a telehealth POS code.</p> <p><b>Example:</b> A doctor has a video conference on Zoom with a patient to talk to them about their hypertension and discusses ways to manage the condition.</p>  | <p><b>Evaluation and management outpatient office visit codes:</b><br/>99201 – 99205, 99211-99215</p> <p><b>Preventive service codes:</b><br/>99381-99385, 99391-99395</p> <p><b>Place of Service (POS):</b> 02<br/><b>modifier:</b> 95 (Synchronous telemedicine service rendered via <i>real-time</i> interactive audio/video system)</p> <p><b>* Some codes might not be covered by HFS' Practitioner Fee Schedule but are required to close HEDIS gaps in care.</b></p> |

| <p><b>Synchronous telephone visits</b></p> | <p><b>Require real-time audio-only visits.</b> These visits are considered synchronous visits but do not include video interaction. These visits are used for patients who do not have access to or chose not to use video or web access.</p>   | <p><b>Telephone visits – Audio-only codes:</b><br/> 99441–99443 (Physicians, NPs, and PAs)<br/> 98966–98968 (non-physicians)<br/> <b>Place of Service (POS): 02</b><br/> <b>modifier:</b> GT (via interactive audio/video system)<br/> <b>* Some codes might not be covered by HFS’ Practitioner Fee Schedule but are required to close HEDIS gaps in care.</b></p> |
| <p><b>Asynchronous E-visits</b></p>        | <p>Sometimes referred to as an e-visit or virtual check in.<br/> <b>This visit is not real-time, but still requires two-way interaction between the member and provider.</b> It is a digital communication that a patient must initiate — often done through a portal or email.</p> <p>This visit requires a clinical decision that typically would be provided in an office. Time is cumulative during a 7-day period. Providers can use CPT codes for these visits based on time.</p> | <p><b>Online assessment CPT:</b><br/> 98969-98972, 99421-99423, 99444, 99457<br/> <b>Used by those who can bill E&amp;M services</b></p> <p><b>Online assessment HCPCS:</b><br/> G0071, G2061-G2063<br/> <b>Used by those who cannot bill E&amp;M services</b></p> <p><b>Virtual check-in code:</b> G2010 and G2012</p>   |

## Approved practitioners

Practitioners who are approved to provide telehealth are subject to state laws and regulations. They include all or some of the following:

- Physicians
- Nurse practitioners
- Physician assistants
- Clinical nurse specialists
- Clinical psychologists and psychiatrists
- Clinical counselors
- Clinical social workers
- Registered dietitians or nutrition professionals
- Occupational, physical and speech therapists

| <b>CBP</b>                 | <b>P4P</b>                 | <b>Controlling High Blood Pressure:</b><br>The percentage of members 18–85 years of age who had a diagnosis of hypertension (HTN) and whose BP were adequately controlled (<140/90 mm Hg) during the measurement year. <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Patient-reported blood pressure readings taken with a digital device is required in documentation.</li><li>• It should be clearly stated in the medical record that the blood pressure was taken by the patient and documented during the telehealth visit.</li><li>• BP adequately controlled (&lt;140/90mm Hg) meets compliance for measure.</li><li>• Most recent controlled BP reading documented meets criteria for this measure.</li></ul> | <b>Type of services:</b><br>Telehealth<br>Telephone visits | Commercial<br>Medicaid<br>Medicare |
