

All adults need the flu shot every year. The flu shot is the best way to guard yourself and your family from the flu. For most, the flu can be a mild illness, but some adults are at high risk for severe illness, hospitalization, or even death.

Adults at High Risk:

- Residents of nursing homes or other long-term care facilities
- People who have medical conditions, such as:
 - o Asthma and COPD
 - Neurological conditions
 - o Chronic lung disease
 - Heart disease
 - o Blood disorders
 - Diabetes
 - Kidney disorders
 - Liver disorders
 - Weakened immune system due to medications, or disease such as HIV, AIDS, or Cancer
 - o People who are extremely overweight

Call your doctor to get a flu shot. Flu shots are also offered at most retail pharmacies in our network. Check the <u>Pharmacy Locator for a pharmacy near you</u>.
